Synopsis: In my book dissertation, I explore the causes and consequences of affective polarization among politicians. Using original surveys of state legislative candidates, local elected officials, and congressional staff, I show how affective polarization has trickled up from the mass level, influencing the process of policy-making and the functioning of representation.
